PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS

Merry Christmas!

Wow, did that sound strange! I'm writing this November 13. How many shopping days left?

And earlier this morning I finished off other newsletter material, including (are you ready?) an announcement about Lent.

So here we are, mid-November, and I've skipped ahead to Christmas, and beyond. Pretty sad! Can't even find the time to enjoy the season. Like retailers who tear down their Christmas displays by noon on December 26, I'm all over the map. Can't let Christmas be Christmas...if even for just a moment.

Maybe.

A recent article I wrote elicited a puzzling response from a reader who claimed I had a bias. For the record, the reader totally missed it – any bias I had was the other direction, the direction the reader wanted me to go. Here, however, I'll be clear – I have a bias, and it's a big one – the cross!

Now, don't get me wrong. I love Christmas. I love the carols, candlelight, worship, snow, decorations, and even the music that began already at the beginning of November.

Christmas, however, isn't about the trappings of the season. Christmas is something bigger. Christmas is the breaking into our world of God's plan for life, which, in our sight begins in the manger and acts decisively in the cross. In

the cross, God makes the difference between life and death, and brings all of God's plan together.

That's why I'm biased about the cross. In whatever we do as a community of faith, the cross of Jesus stands at the center. It's the cross that gives us life, allows us to fail and be redeemed, and holds us together. Around the cross, we gather, and in the power of the cross, we live. We make mistakes, we are vulnerable, but we are renewed in Jesus, not in ourselves.

The cross that empowers us also challenges us to live a different life, and to be faithful to God's vision, and that isn't always a vision we find comfortable. We are called to welcome the newborn child of Bethlehem. That part's easy. But we are also called to welcome those who might not be welcome other places into our midst. Because the cross has lifted us up, we recognize that our gathering is God's doing, and all of God's people are welcome to God's place.

In the end, the visible (to our eyes) part of the journey begins in the manger. In the manger, God comes into our midst in the person of Jesus Christ, and begins to walk to the cross. The cross is the point – the cross is precisely why we have a Christmas!

So, it shouldn't rattle me that even before Christmas, I'm thinking Lent...and the cross. Got to have the cross around if we are going to celebrate Christmas for what it really is – the coming of God in Jesus to bring us new life!

But if Christmas is about God coming to us in Jesus, becoming “incarnate,” in flesh, then Christmas isn’t just a fleeting moment of joy and wonder. Just as the cross swirls around us daily, so does Christmas, or at least, the point of Christmas. That God is present in our midst *every day* through Jesus is what Christmas brings to us – and that doesn’t go away when the decorations are taken down. God remains with us, through the journey to the cross and beyond, into our daily lives.

That also means that the crucified Jesus, part of our daily lives, calls us to faithful living every day as we welcome all into our midst, not because we need the congregation to grow, or even because we are politically correct. Rather, because God is in our midst through Jesus, bringing us new life through the cross, empowering us to be difference makers in the lives of others.

So here’s my thought – celebrate God’s coming into our world at Christmas with gusto, but keep an eye on the cross.

And when the Christmas goodies are gone, the decorations packed away, and the music no longer heard, and you approach the cross of Good Friday, keep an eye on the manger too!

There’s my bias!

CONGREGATION COUNCIL REVIEW

The Congregation Council met on Monday, November 9, with President Char Buelow presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Opened with prayer.
- Reviewed and approved the minutes of the October meeting. Also reviewed and accepted the October financial reports and pastors' reports.
- Adopted revisions to the Emergency Action Plan.
- Heard an update on the Mill Street House and its removal.
- Approved the hiring of Tim Bowman as Interim Director of Youth and Family Ministry.
- Discussed the changes in custodial staff.
- Discussed the lease with ChildFirst for 2016. Approved renewing the lease for 2016.
- Set the annual meeting for Sunday, January 31, following 10:30 a.m. worship.
- Approved the housing allowance designation for 2016.
- Approved a contribution of \$500 toward Cathryn Bottem's mission trip to Thailand in January.
- Noted that the December meeting will be at the pastors' home.

The council meets again on Monday, December 14, at Pastor Jon and Pastor Jean's home. See Char Buelow or one of the pastors if you have any questions.

MISSION DISCERNMENT

The Vision Team and Space Team met together in early November and they continue to move forward in their work. The teams are looking at our ministry, and what God is calling us to be. They are also looking at how our assets, including our space, enable our faithful ministry.

Monday, December 14th at 9:30 AM

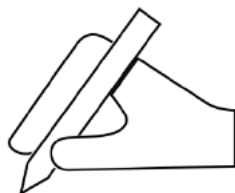

Disciples come in all shapes and sizes. We have much to learn from our "elders" as these resident theologians have insights and stories to share. Yolanda Craig graciously allowed us to share a glimpse into her story. Yolanda, 92 years young, learned to drive in 1957 at the age of 34 alongside of the high school students at West Salem. She stopped driving a couple of years ago when she started looking like those "old people" she used to think shouldn't be driving anymore!

Yolanda's advice to new disciples of Jesus
... there is nothing better to believe in than faith. Anything else does not seem worthwhile.

Yolanda's favorite Bible passage ...
because ... Psalm 23 because it has stuck with her the most.

Yolanda's earliest memories of church ...
Yolanda grew up at South Beaver Creek church. She said they didn't have Sunday School, but for two weeks every summer, starting when she was 7 years old until she was confirmed, they would gather at the church for Norwegian School where they studied the catechism and bible history. Yolanda remembers cutting across pastures with animals and farm fields gathering up her friends along the way on the three mile walk to the church. Yolanda also remembers her mother reading the Bible to Yolanda's nephews during the summer.

Yolanda remembers being on the funeral committee at Our Savior's starting in 1957 and doing it until she couldn't go anymore.

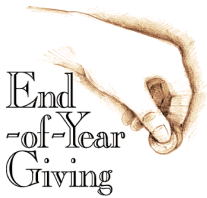
