Pastor's Reflections ...

This Pastor's Reflections also serves as our monthly "Stewardship Corner," but it's not an article I really want to write. Normally, I love stewardship. Stewardship and discipleship – really the same thing – using wisely what God has entrusted to me, and being generous with all I have. That's exciting stuff, especially when that allows me to do "God's work with my hands." When it allows me the privilege of being a part of God's mission in the world. What could be greater than that?

But this month I'm addressing money, and that's a bit challenging. Not that I don't think it's important to talk money – money is a vital part of our stewardship, and we even include that in our 9th grade confirmation curriculum. It's just the last thing we want to do is to beg and plead for money for the sake of keeping the doors open. Remember? Stewardship is about mission, not keeping the organization alive. In other words, seek financial support, but for the right reason – for the sake of the good news of Jesus!

Still, our budget right now is a bit tight. This is our first year without any income from the day care, and while many have increased their financial support, others, for whatever reason, perhaps even very good ones, have remained steady, or reduced their support. Sometimes that happens when we aren't in worship – we miss a Sunday or two, and that drops our giving. Or maybe there are other circumstances in life – bills are up, other challenges arise. And then...sometimes we just don't remember – happens to all of us!

So, don't take this as a plea to save the church, or a sign that we are in big trouble. We're not. We're just a bit flat.

Yet, at the same time there are some things you need to know. Like the impact of not having the day care. Some of that is money. The dollars are shorter, to be sure.

But there's more. The space! Consider the ministries that have been impacted, in one way or another by our new space: *Confirmation, Sunday School, funeral lunches, Youth Ministry, Music Ministry, Food Pantry, quilting, men's ministry, and Frolic*. Every one of these ministries has benefitted in real and tangible ways from our new and flexible space. Yes, that space has a cost (the loss of rental income), but ministry is happening better than ever because we have it.

But it's not just space. Look at what else is happening these days:

- New ministries – like Frolic for 0-3 year olds, and a new men's group.
- We had a large number of new confirmation students this year across all four grades, with the 6th grade class up to 34 kids.
- In 2017, in our synod, we were the second largest supporter of campus ministry (where young adults are changed!), and the fourth largest in world hunger offerings (and that doesn't include support for the Food Pantry or the summer lunch program).
- We discovered only weeks ago that the school did not get a grant to take on the summer lunch program. No matter – we know what to do, and we are mobilizing to make that ministry happen again – for the sake of children, and for the sake of Jesus.

But what about numbers? Doesn't it seem like worship is down this year? It is (I think), and it is (I know) in most congregations. That's one of the changes in our society these days. More mobile, more diversions, more challenging. But consider this: while our attendance is a bit down, the number of people involved in our ministries is up – over the first four months from 817 to 831. Not down, up!

The reality is that our budget is tighter, tighter than usual, and a bit behind, but it's tight and behind because we are reaching out, making a difference, and changing lives. And isn't that what we are to be about?

For that reason, I can be bold to ask you to continue, and even consider increasing your financial support. Not to keep the doors open, or keep us afloat. Instead, to invite you to be a part of God's work, and to be what God has formed and fashioned us to be: *a church centered in Christ, inviting all into a community of worship, nurturing all to be disciples of Jesus, and together reaching out to make a difference here and throughout the world.*

But as I ask, please hear this too - *thank you – THANK YOU! – for the support you have already shared with us!* Not for us, but for our ministry, our calling. We make things happen as, gathered by the Holy Spirit, we work together. For the sake of the world; for the sake of Jesus!

Colorado Peaches

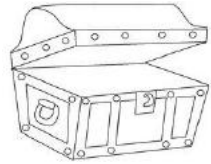

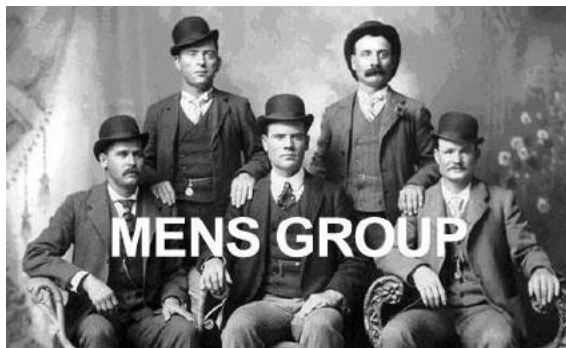
Confirmation

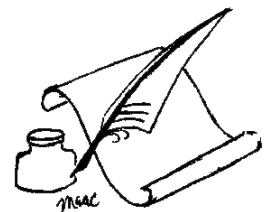

Congregation Council Review



The Congregation Council met on Monday, May 14, with Vice President Dan Roemhild calling the meeting to order. At this meeting the council:

- Began with devotions based on 1 Corinthians 13:13.
- Approved the minutes from the April council meeting. Received and reviewed financial reports and reports from the pastors.
- Discussed same gender marriages and the recent congregational conversations. Adopted a resolution noting that Our Savior's and its pastors only preside at weddings with valid licenses, provided the participants have had consultation and counseling with the pastor(s).
- Heard an update on the membership review.
- Heard about an upcoming synod sponsored congregational renewal ministry. Directed the pastors to order copies of The Agile Church for each council member, and decided to use the book as the basis for study and reflection beginning in September.
- Heard an update on Johnson South and the change in tenants.
- Discussed some changes in the confirmation program being considered for next year, including gifting students with copies of a contemporary translation of the Bible.
- Affirmed the confirmation class of 2018 as voting members of the congregation.
- Decided to use \$1,000 from the Fair Trade Coffee Fund to "fund" two sheep for the synod assembly.
- Received Douglas and Kim Sloan as members by transfer from Trinity/La Crosse.
- Added Judy Gilbert and Eric Sorensen as voting members of the 2018 La Crosse Area Synod Assembly.

The council meets again on Monday, June 11. See Steve Ahles or one of the pastors if you have any questions.



Same Gender Marriage Conversation

After much conversation on the council and in the congregation, the Congregation Council has adopted the following:

"To affirm that weddings at Our Savior's, either inside the building or in other locations, are performed for persons with a valid marriage license, and with the appropriate consultation and counseling of the pastors."

Based on conversations with other congregations in our area, the Congregation Council does not believe that this will substantially change our ministry. It does, however, reaffirm our mission statement that Our Savior's intends to be a place of welcome and outreach to all of God's creation.

We thank all who were a part of the process of discerning God's call. As a community we remain committed to faithful living as disciples of Jesus, and to living in care for one another. If you have any concerns or reflections we invite you to contact one of the pastors.
