Pastor's Reflections ...

As you may know, I have been making plans for my sabbatical in summer of 2019. Briefly, a sabbatical for a pastor is a three month leave from congregational work for the purpose of rest, renewal, and maybe a bit of growing as well.

In the La Crosse Area Synod congregations are expected to provide for a sabbatical for their pastors after five years of service. I have never had a sabbatical, and neither has Pastor Jean. While I am away, Pastor Jean will carry out pastoral duties here. I'll do the same when she looks at taking a sabbatical in another year or two. That way the congregation's ministry is covered, and we'll each take our leave in the summer months when things are a bit slower.

But...along with my sabbatical team, a group of seven leaders from the congregation, and with the blessing of the Congregation Council, I prepared and submitted a grant proposal to the Lily Foundation. The grant would have integrated my sabbatical experience with several congregational events while I was gone. It would have provided funding for a variety of activities for me, and also support congregational activities. We worked hard to formulate a good, solid proposal.

Alas, we did not receive the grant.

Immediately, it means that the plans we had will need to be reconsidered. Some of what we wanted to do as a congregation we still can – and will – do, especially an intergenerational mission trip next summer. Think about it...pray about it...how about you? Ready to make a difference and be changed yourself?

On my side, the core of my sabbatical – a family trip to Germany – will still take place. We've been looking forward to that for several years. But, then...I'm just not yet sure. We're going to have to rethink and reconsider what might happen, and how that might be refreshing and renewing to me.

But back to Our Savior's. A sabbatical is a time for rest and renewal, but also to be revitalized. In a fast changing world, with all sorts of crises and challenges, congregational life gets a bit tired and worn sometimes too. As a community we too need to be revitalized. So, what do you think? A congregational "time-out?"

Or maybe instead, we need to learn how to be a bit more "agile." Agile – to be able to respond fearlessly and faithfully to the community around us. To be able to meet new needs in new ways. To be disciples of a living Jesus in the midst of all the change around us.

Along with the other five synods in Wisconsin and The Upper Peninsula of Michigan, the La Crosse Area Synod is developing a new ministry that works with congregations. We have asked the synod to consider Our Savior's as one of the congregations they work with. Although we don't know all the details yet, we expect to develop a team of leaders, lay persons, who care about the ministry of the church, our calling to be faithful disciples, and most of all, who love Jesus. This group won't include the pastors. With the

guidance of an outside mentor it will help us understand our setting, the needs of people around us, our giftedness and our calling as a community of faith.

In the meantime, the Congregation Council, and several other leaders have begun reading one of the resources for this ministry, The Agile Church. If you are interested, let me know – I’ve got a few extra copies.

The possibilities here excite me because this sounds a lot to me like “revitalization” – a renewal and restoration of our ministry, grounded in Jesus and the power of the Holy Spirit. Or, put another way, “fearless and faithful!”

To be sure, this will not always be easy. As we take a long look at who we think we are, we will need to ask if that is what God is calling us to be. And we might discover that some of our life and work doesn’t do what we thought it did. But remember, we are always in the hands of Jesus.

And that’s what I need too. I too need God’s work in me through Jesus, empowered by the Holy Spirit, to have a moment of “Sabbath,” of revitalization. Today, tomorrow, next week, and yes, even during my Sabbatical leave.

I’m still not sure how I will restructure my sabbatical time, and I’ll probably look to my team for some support and insight. That’s how God works sometimes – through those around us! But whatever I come up with, I’ll work to anchor myself in Jesus, living out the power of God’s Holy Spirit.

Meanwhile, we will keep you posted on the “agile church” process, and how Our Savior’s – and you – might be involved. Until then, remember it’s about Jesus. Jesus who holds us, embraces us, calls us, and leads us!

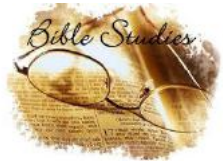

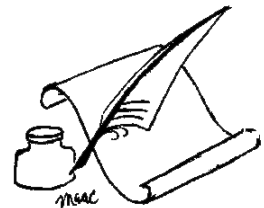

The Congregation Council met on Monday, August 13, at the home of Steve and Sue Ahles. Prior to the meeting the council members and families enjoyed a meal together, thanks to the hospitality of Steve and Sue. Afterward, President Ahles called the meeting to order. At this meeting the council:



- Approved the council minutes from June, and received financial reports and reports from the pastors for June and July.
- Heard about vacation and continuing education schedule for the pastors.
- Received an update from the Rental Management Committee.
- Received an update on the Prayer Labyrinth project.
- Received Joe and Toccara Crankshaw, and their family, as members.
- Discussed a bequest from the estate of John Anderson. Per bylaws, 70% is placed in the Endowment Fund; the remainder (\$600) will be designated to strengthen the ministry of the Corn Roast.
- Decided not to receive back the old church organ that was in John Anderson's possession.
- Heard an update on Pastor Jon's sabbatical for 2019.
- Designated Kris Seeger as an emergency check signer on church accounts.
- Affirmed the use of our building by Coulee Christian School as a student shelter should there be an emergency in their building.
