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Pastor's Reflections

I am tired, I am weak, I am worn ...

Hours of work and creativity expended, and what is there to show for it ... nothing ... lost ... never to be found ... and no energy to recreate it ...

It could be any one of us, the details may be different but the scenario is the same. You put your heart and soul into something, and then you find out it was for naught ... the work, the effort, and what you were working on, is gone, not recoverable, nowhere to be found ... and you just can't do it again, you can't re-create it ... it took everything you had and you have nothing more to offer.

These last fourteen months have taken their toll. Trying to be creative and innovative; scrambling to make sure things are done; connecting and reconnecting in new ways; trying to please everyone and not succeeding; giving everything you have until you have nothing more to give; putting the needs, cares, and desires of others before your own; no matter what you do, it's not enough; wanting desperately to be in control, when nothing is in your control; trying to tactfully reign in those who are anxious to move on, pleading with them to follow the rules/guidelines just a bit longer. And now, when it's time to begin to return to some semblance of "the way it used to be", when it's time to get excited, when all of the "i's" need to be dotted and the "t's" crossed, you need to dig deeply for the energy to be creative again because it's not yet time for "normal" and "auto-pilot" ... but it's just not there ... the fight is gone ... the will is gone ...

These feelings could belong to any number of vocations ... healthcare workers, teachers, students, pastors, small business owners, front line workers, those caring for the most vulnerable ...

Jesus took the weight of the world upon his shoulders on the cross of Good Friday, so that we could be renewed and have new life in him on Easter morning. The journey to the cross was long, and wearying, and now that Easter is here, we are supposed to feel refreshed and renewed, we are supposed to feel unburdened and ready to move forward. But are we? Do we really feel unburdened and ready to move forward?

The calendar may say Easter has come, but the season of our soul is still heavy and weighed down. If the last fourteen months have taught us anything, they have taught us we can't do this on our own. We need the crucified and risen Jesus. We need forgiveness and grace. We need the Holy Spirit to swirl within us and lead us.



As we begin to set our sights on re-opening the building for worship and perhaps small group meetings/gatherings, we are eager and we are anxious. But we also need to take our time and do things properly, always keeping our sights centered on Jesus. For the sake of others, we need to be patient and thoughtful. We need to think of others and not just ourselves. The Re-opening Team and the Council have discussed and researched and come up with a plan to keep us safe while finding ways to enable us to begin gathering as a community again.

We invite you to join us on the journey to gather together, but we also caution you that we need everyone to be understanding and willing to follow the guidelines outlined (see page 8 or check out the church website). God calls us to love our neighbor and care for them.

As we move forward initially, things will still look different ... there will be things we need to do ... there will be guidelines we need to respect and follow ... there will be room for grace and conversation, but there will also be things that are non-negotiable ... together we will be the community of the faithful ... together we will worship ... together we will follow God's call.

Zoom Communion ... join us on Sundays at **10:00 AM** (*Note the time change!*) in virtual worship, using the Zoom platform. Easy to do – just head to our home page, and click on the link. Have bread and wine/juice available. You will be “joining” the in-person worship.



Annual Meeting

Note that the Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, June 13, following 10 AM worship at the Lion's Shelter. We

will hear reports from the various committees, approve the 2021 budget, have elections, and hear a proposal and vote on a new technology/upgraded audio system project.

Highlights of the Technology/Audio Project



The Congregation Council is preparing a proposal for the congregation to consider at the Annual Meeting – to significantly upgrade the technology in the sanctuary!

What's included on the project?

- Adding the ability to project words, music, and images on a screen in the front, along with a smaller screen for the area under the balcony.
- Installing the equipment to livestream our worship, then post the recording online, and create quality DVDs for our shut-ins. The equipment would allow for several camera angles along with zooming in for closeups. The camera would produce an HD quality picture.
- A major overhaul of the audio system, which hasn't had a significant upgrade in over 30 years!

The cost? Around \$40,000. The good news? Thanks to the Endowment Fund and a very generous donor, we already have \$14,000! More details in the June newsletter and at the annual meeting.

In-Building Worship ...

In-building worship begins in May on Saturdays at 6 PM, Sundays at 10 AM, and Wednesdays at 5:30 PM. We will hear God's Word, sing quietly, and share in

Holy Communion.

There are several things **you need to know** as you make plans to join us.

- **Sign up** on SignUpGenius using the link (<https://www.signupgenius.com/go/20F044CA5A629A7F85-worship>) or call the office (786-0030) and we will be happy to get you signed up.
- Attendance at each service will be **limited to 50** people. (When we worship at the Lion's Shelter in June, there will be no limit on numbers.)
- **Masks are REQUIRED** for those 2 years old and older. (If you forget your mask, we will have them available.)
- **Doors will be open 15 minutes** prior to the start of worship. We invite you to have your conversations outside.
- **Enter through the door off the alley/parking lot.** (If you need the elevator, please let us know that when you sign up and we will have someone greet you at the front door.)
- We will need an **usher/host team** in place or worship will be cancelled. (We will let you know in advance if worship is cancelled.) If you would like to be a part of the usher/host team check out the information about the upcoming training session on April 28th.
- **Windows** must remain **open** so dress accordingly.

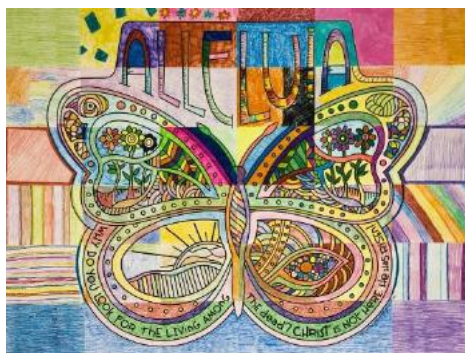
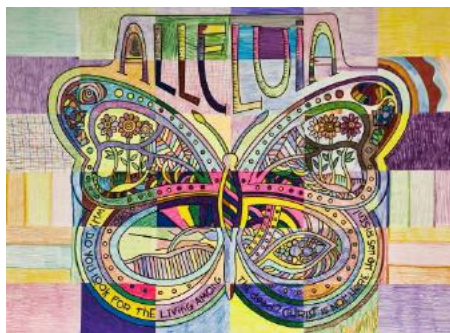

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met via Zoom on Monday, April 12th, with President Steve Ahles presiding. At this meeting:

- The Council was joined by Dean Olson who shared more detailed information about the proposed technology project and additional audio upgrade.
- Heard the tech/audio project would cost approximately \$40,000.
- Approved the minutes of the March 8 Council Meeting, and received the March financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries. Noted pastors are now back at Lakeview for worship and anticipate going to Salem Terrace.
- Heard a report and recommendations from the Re-opening Team. Council established the guidelines to be followed in order to have worship in person in the building. Heard there will be a training for those willing to be ushers/hosts during re-opening worship.
- Approved the request of the tenant in Johnson South to terminate his lease early. He will be done May 15.
- Discussed items for Annual Congregational Meeting in June including potential names for nominations. Voted to present the proposed 2021 budget prepared by the Administration Committee to the Annual Meeting.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, May 10th at 7 PM via Zoom. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Steve Ahles or one of the pastors.
