Pastor's Reflections

I'm writing this on January 26. A day with all sorts of connections ... to other days!

Consider:

- This morning it was bitterly cold – 21 below at our house.
- Today, in the office, we had some conversations about upcoming schedules, including Ash Wednesday.
- Last year, on Ash Wednesday (February 17), we did outdoor ashes – and it was bitterly cold – 10 below at our house.
- On Ash Wednesday, last year, in the midst of the cold, a car ended up in the snowbank and we pushed it out.
- Today, in the midst of the cold, a car ended up in the snowbank and we pushed it out.
- Oh, and did I mention? One month ago today we were resting after a busy Christmas celebration.

All sorts of connections. Today to a year ago, to a month ago. Cold then, cold now. Cars stuck then, cars stuck now. All the while we remember where we were just one month ago. It's all connected, and it's all ... "Deja vu all over again!"

Or, the more things change, the more they stay the same.

Cold then, cold now ... people in need then, people in need now ... important spiritual moments then (Christmas and Ash Wednesday), important spiritual moments now (Ash Wednesday soon to come) ... and of course, Covid then, Covid now.

The more things change, the more they stay the same.

Boring ... wearying ... overwhelming ...

And then, soon to come (but before you read this), our annual meeting. Let's see ... this will be my 35th annual meeting (I missed one in 1992 – long story – ask me about it if you're curious). 35 budgets approved, 35 minutes, 35 elections, and so on. Over and over again.

Have you caught a pattern here? Challenges ... celebrations ... ministries, many rather mundane ... dates on the calendar ... all coming and going ... and coming again. Over and over ... again!

The more things change, the more they stay the same.

That's right. The more things change, the more they stay the same. We are stuck in patterns of life that repeat, over and over. Yes, Covid is new, the challenge of a lifetime. But so was the Cold War, the war on terror, the Great Depression, the Spanish Flu pandemic, the Bubonic Plague ...



And the dates on the calendar, flying away, one year after another. Been through that before too.

And cars stuck in the snowbank – been there, done that!

The fact is that we've been down this road before. Like living an endless loop that keeps going and going and going ... And that makes it all the more wearying and burdensome. Won't life ever change?

Probably not, and that, surprisingly, is a good thing! A good thing because life is not about the tough moments that overwhelm us. Nor is life about how we figure out how we

can at least avoid those tough moments, or even overcome them. Life is about “God at work – in our life, and in our world.”

We joke sometimes that you should have been at my Bible study last week because we discovered the “meaning of life” – and you missed it! As though the “meaning of life” is some mystery that we yearn to uncover. In fact, it’s pretty simple. Life is God at work ... and the meaning of life is discovering, celebrating, and being embraced by “God at work” right here in my little corner of the world, but also across the globe.

And how does “God at work” happen? Through Jesus, the child, the teacher and healer, the crucified and risen one. In Jesus, life has meaning because in Jesus God creates life (you and me), renews and restores worn out life (you and me), empowers life (you and me), and sends life forward (you guessed it, you and me!).

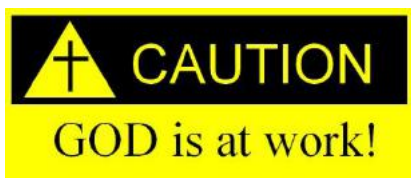
Which brings us to the point. In a world in which “the more things change, the more they stay the same,” so much of life seems to be “in a rut,” and not in a good way. But as much as we seem to be in an endless loop, well, we are. Stuck in the endless loop of God’s embrace, God’s love and care, God’s renewal of life, and God’s calling to share life with the world around us. That is the constant of all constants. Yes, life isn’t changing – God’s life is not changing! And that is a good thing!



That too is where our journey is right now. We are in Epiphany, a season of discovering God’s revelation of life through Jesus. Discovering that the Jesus of the manger, who shortly will become the Jesus of the cross and the resurrection, is the real deal. Jesus is God at work. And so, when Jesus comes into our world, it’s God in our midst. And when Jesus takes the brokenness of life upon himself on the

cross, it's God sacrificing for us. And when Jesus triumphs in the resurrection, it's God restoring life.

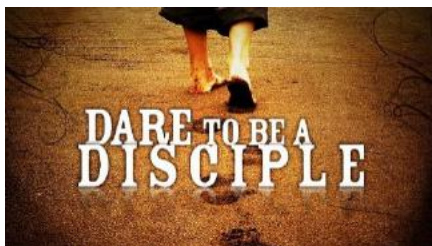
And that – God at work in Jesus – is the meaning of life. As I trudge through difficult days, as I yearn for a renewal of hope, as I make a difference in the lives of others, it's all about God at work in Jesus – in me!



So, yep, good news! The more things change, the more they stay the same. God is still at work, Jesus is still my Savior, and I am still a disciple.

The annual meeting will need to elect voting members to the 2022 La Crosse Area Synod Assembly sometime in the near future. Otherwise, the assembly will be held virtually. Regardless, expenses are covered. Assemblies involve business, fellowship, worship, and a lot of learning about the work of God’s people!



Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, January 17, with President Jen Linse presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in discussion and prayer centering on the ministries of the church.
- Received a presentation from Melody Schmitz and Lee Friell of the Mission Endowment Fund Committee. Approved a recommendation to the annual meeting for changes to the Endowment Fund operation plan.
- Approved the minutes of the December 13 Council Meeting, and received the December financial report.
- Heard an overview on what has been happening with our various ministries, and that Kris Seeger has returned to the office after her medical leave.
- Voted to recommend to the annual meeting the budget proposal as presented.
- Decided to place the Mission Endowment disbursement for capital projects into the Building Centennial Fund for future use.
- Heard updates on the Audit Committee and the Property Committee.
- Heard that the tech project is getting closer and should be completed by the end of May.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, February 14th at 7 PM. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Jen Linse or one of the pastors.

- 18

- Adopted three amendments to the Mission Endowment Fund governing document:
 - o Removed undesignated memorials from the income stream.
 - o Increased the cap on the Fund from \$750,000 to \$1,500,000.
 - o Decided that future disbursements will be recommended by the committee and approved by the Annual Meeting.
- Closed the meeting with prayer.

Again, we are grateful to all who participated in the meeting as we not only heard where we have been, but also, through our elections, our budget, and our partnership, set a direction for our ministry in 2022 and beyond. Thank you to all!

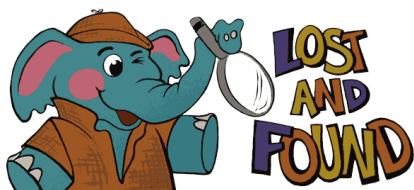
