Pastor's Reflections

My Cup is running over ...

In his Easter sermon, Pastor Jon talked about seeing things through the lens of our cup being half empty. We can relate to that, can't we? We are living in a broken world, there is so much violence and hatred, people are grieving the death of loved ones, we are afraid to go to the doctor for fear of what we might be told, we are tired and weary, and wondering if we can go on – the cup is half empty.

But then he turned it around and showed how our cups are really overflowing. Even in the midst of all of the emptiness, the resurrected Jesus is there filling us to overflowing. Filling us with new life, new energy, new perspectives.



The resurrected Jesus hasn't changed the world with all of its challenges, hurts, and pains, but we have been changed, and we find ourselves faced with new opportunities, new ways of doing things, and new people.

In the church, as we begin to create a new sense of "normal", now is the time for each of us to embrace these new opportunities, learn new ways of doing things, try new things, and engage with new people. Planning ahead ...

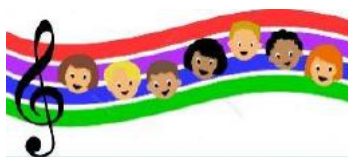
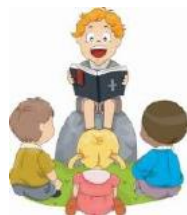
It may only be May, but it's never too early to start thinking about the fall ... *really, it's not!*
