Pastor's Reflections

As Pastor Jean embarks on her sabbatical, I'm going to try something different this summer. It might work. It might not.

Regardless, I'm going to try. But more on that in a moment. First...

It's just past "mid-May," and spring has sprung! The temps are rising, the rain is gently falling, and the world is alive! It doesn't get any better than this!

Or does it? Look at the headlines – Covid cases are rising again, the war in the Ukraine continues, the economy may be heading for a recession, and – I'm serious – there is a case of "Monkeypox." And on top of all that, I need a new lawnmower!

Yep, life sure is grand!

In the face of all that, it seems more like the onset of "bummer" rather than "summer." And after 2+ years of stress, conflict, and uncertainty, hope is hard to find. What's there to hope for when it just seems like we are on a treadmill heading ... nowhere?

But there are signs of hope. Sometimes those signs are exactly what we expect. We look, we see, we discern that God is at work in our world, and in our lives. Like a spiritual experience in worship, or a stunning sunset, or the presence of someone special who picks us up and carries us for a while.



Other times the signs of hope come in surprising places. They wow us, and remind us that God works in very mysterious, and frequently very unexpected ways. Like the “pick-me-up” from someone who we never thought “had it in them.” Or the troubling, difficult moment that suddenly revealed itself to be “God at work.”



And then there are the moments that are signs of hope, fairly obvious, but also seemingly insignificant and unimportant. A moment of “so what,” yet nonetheless a moment, a sign of hope in a broken world. I had one of those today!

Last week we planted around the house, both annuals and some vegetables. They are doing fine, and they should. We bought the “ready-made plants,” carefully placed them in the soil, and between my watering and the gift of rain, they’ve been nurtured five out of the past six days. I expect some growth. No real sign there.

But then there was the last pot. Rebecca had come into possession of a packet of seeds. We planted them too, watered like we did the others, and waited ... and there, earlier today, I saw them. Two plants breaking the surface of the soil. And I'm watching for more.



Big deal, right? Isn't that what seeds, planted in soil, and watered regularly are supposed to do?

Sure! They did what they are supposed to do. Predictable and, quite frankly, a bit boring. And hey, two small seeds in a pot on Remington Street in West Salem, germinated like they are supposed to do – what else, but insignificant and unimportant. We have real problems in the world and I'm supposed to get excited over two small seeds doing their job?

Yet, those two small seeds, insignificant and unimportant, even boring, are indeed a sign – a big sign. They are a sign that even in the “run of the mill,” day to day living, God is still at work!

Frequently, we look for something really impressive, the flashy work of a God who does the big stuff really well. But my day to day life is filled with lots of little stuff, and that’s the stuff that makes life rich and full. Where no one else is watching, God is at work. In the overlooked, insignificant, unimportant, boring moments, a sign that life is still in God’s hands.

I saw the plants growing, and pondered, just for a moment – I was already a bit late for our worship at Salem Terrace – how even in these wearying days, there in a small pot, God is at work. And if God can be at work even in the insignificance of two simple seeds, God can be – and is – at work in my life!

Just a simple sign. A simple gift. Thank you, gracious God!



Which brings me back to where I started. My “summer experiment.”

I’d like to try something. Each Wednesday, beginning June 8, from 6-7 PM, at least for the month of June (we’ll see after that), I’m going to head over to the Prayer Labyrinth. Come and join me. Bring a chair, a beverage or snack, and your Bible. No formal, in depth, “let’s all be Bible scholars” Bible study. Instead, just an easy, low stress, relaxing time to read, share, and pray. I’ll pull out a few of my favorite Bible passages and stories, and we’ll see what nuggets we can find – reading, but also sharing our own insights, and our own faith stories (really, I want to hear your journey). And maybe, in the midst of our

tense, uncertain world, to also see a few seeds beginning to sprout. To see a sign or two, signs that might otherwise seem insignificant and unimportant, but signs nonetheless that God is at work in us, in our world, and in our corner of the world.



If the weather doesn't cooperate, we'll move indoors. But either way, we will just relax, take some time, hear God speak, and see God at work.

Join me – *and let's together watch the seeds grow!*

Planning ahead ...

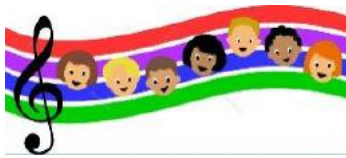
It may only be June, but it's never too early to start thinking about the fall ... *really, it's not!*

Prayer Labyrinth

As the weather warms, don't forget about the Prayer Labyrinth which Our Savior's has across from the parking lot. It's open, it's free, and it's just waiting for you!

What is a "prayer labyrinth?" A labyrinth is a path that leads from the outside to the center. Not a maze designed to confuse, a labyrinth is instead a way to symbolically leave behind the hustle and bustle of the world, and enter a place of peace and quiet, where one can engage God in prayer and meditation. There's even a bench at the center for a time of reflection!

We invite you to use the labyrinth, and let your friends know that it's there. To follow the labyrinth, find the grassy path between the bricks along the side closest to the side walk...and then follow around and along until you come to the center. And when you are done, follow the path back as you reenter a busy and sometimes very hectic world!

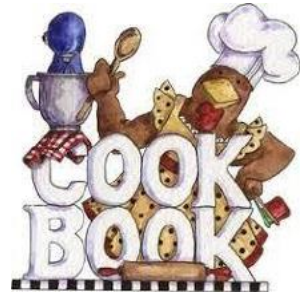

Audit Committee Report

The Audit Committee has completed an audit of the church's accounts and financial practices. In conducting the audit, the committee reviewed the WELCA account, the Quilting account, the Youth account and selected months of the general fund account. The committee also reviewed financial procedures for handling, counting and depositing offerings; procedures for payroll, payments to vendors and accounts payable; procedures for IT access and backup; procedures for the Youth account, including Scrip cards. The committee did not find any account irregularities and found that procedures and internal controls in place are generally adequate to protect the finances of the church. The congregation council has adopted the recommendations from the committee.



Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, May 9, with President Jen Linse presiding. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in devotions centered on Revelation 21:5.
- Continued in conversation around Youth Ministry.
- Approved the minutes of the April 11 Council Meeting, and received the April financial reports.
- Heard an update from the pastors, including observations on recent congregational life.
- Heard an update on Pastor Jean's sabbatical planning, including plans for a congregation cookbook.
- Heard an update on the tech project.
- Received a report from the Audit Committee indicating that the books are in order, and adopted several recommendations from the committee.
- Decided to recommend that due to the significantly increased cost, the peach sale be suspended for this year.
- Discussed the summer council schedule. Council will meet at the fire pit in June (weather permitting) and not meet in July.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, June 13th at 7 PM. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Jen Linse or one of the pastors.
