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Pastor's Reflections

*Reconnecting with the past ...
not returning to the past*

As I thought about the possibility of worship on September 11th, so many thoughts were swirling in my head.

I thought about me being back from sabbatical, and people being back in the sanctuary for worship, and the choir being back, and the kids being back for Sunday school (and confirmation), and a sung liturgy being back, and coffee fellowship being back ...

And, the theme of my sabbatical kept creeping in ... *reconnecting with the past* ...



On that day, we were *reconnecting* with the past, but we weren't *returning* to the past. We can never go back to the way things always were, to be exactly the same. Because in the time in between we have grown, we have learned, we have experienced new things, we have made new connections.



The past will always be a part of who and what we are, it has molded us and formed us, influenced us and taught us; the past will always be important, but it doesn't define who we are now.

I was reminded of that when I was back at my home congregation in suburban Chicago this summer for worship. This was a place that certainly is a part of who I am. It was a place I spent countless hours, soaking it all in, being involved in almost everything a layperson could be a part of.

Church was a part of my very being. They joked that if you wanted to know the whys and wherefores about something, just ask me because I could tell you. That history was important 23+ years ago, but it's different now, there are new people there, new ways of doing things, new traditions. That's not to say the history is not important, because it is, but it no longer defines who that congregation is.

By chance (the Holy Spirit?), I got to preside at communion when I was there (*long story, ask me about it*), and I almost had a panic attack when I started to do it ... I couldn't remember how they always did it, what to say, what to do, I didn't want to make a mistake ... and then I remembered ... they probably do things differently now than when I was there, and I don't know the "new" way. Besides, I'm an ordained person who knows how to preside at communion – *my way* – and so that's the way I did it! I could "reconnect" with the past, but I didn't have to "return" to it.



Going into my sabbatical I didn't realize how important reconnecting with people from my past was going to be. To be able to have long, deep, meaningful conversations that haven't been possible for a long time. To learn how life has changed for each of us, and to realize our past connections are still there, to know that those bonds are still strong.

As I drove home from each reconnection, I was able to take the time to reflect ... and remember ... and smile ... and know how important and special each person was (and is) ... and to know I have taken a bit of each of them with me wherever I have gone, as I have grown and changed and moved on ... not able to return to what has been, but able to reconnect.



Reconnecting rekindles ideas, relationships, and activities.

While we can never return to the past, we can reconnect to it.

Our offerings will “purchase” the needed items. Let’s see how many kits we can “assemble”!

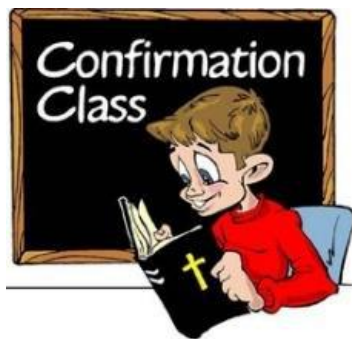


Confirmation instruction for 6th-9th grade continues in October.

- Heard from the Property Committee concerns regarding the flat roof and other future project needs for the building. Asked the committee to continue to explore options and costs.
- Shared in devotions and prayer.
- Shared several new reflections on The Post Quarantine Church, and how we see changes in our world happening around us. Discussed the upcoming “Vital Congregations” training.
- Noted that the youth position is still unfilled, and we continue to seek the right person.
- Discussed a revision of the guiding principles and decided to continue to ponder the best wording and how to use them effectively.
- Received an update on how ministries are “rebooting” this fall, and what the needs of our ministries are.
- Approved the minutes of the August 8 council meeting, and received the August financial reports.
- Heard that the tech project is proceeding with a new provider, and that we are awaiting a new proposal.
- Heard that a “thank-you” for Kathy Brisson will need to be rescheduled, but will happen.
- Received Trudy Drugg as a transfer from Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, Wells, MN.
- Affirmed the hiring of a dishwasher for the Wednesday After School ministry.
