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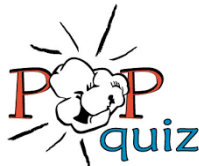


Pastor's Reflections

What's a roof got to do with it? ...

Pop quiz! How many guiding principles does Our Savior's have? Can you name them all? Do you know where to find them? Do you know why we created them?

So many questions ... so many answers??



For the last six months the *Pastor's Reflections* have focused on introducing and explaining one of our guiding principles, and adding to them each month, so by now you have heard about all of them. Answer 1) There are 6 guiding principles.

After much thoughtful and prayerful consideration, conversation, and observation, the guiding principles were crafted to reflect our beliefs, who we are as a people of God, and what we stand for ... Answer 2) ...

- ♥ *Jesus is Lord and Savior.*
- ♥ *All are welcome, and we are intentional about that welcome.*
- ♥ *God gifts and calls every one of every age to be a difference maker in the world.*
- ♥ *We treasure the gift of creation and embrace the call to protect God's world.*
- ♥ *We value the gathering of God's people in worship and all our ministries.*
- ♥ *We seek the guidance of the Holy Spirit in a world that has changed dramatically.*

As I mentioned earlier, you can find the guiding principles in the last six newsletters (Answer 3). As time goes on, they will pop up in various places throughout the church so you can begin to recognize them and commit them to your heart

and memory. They may be a bit “wordy”, so pick out key words and phrases that will help you remember.

Which brings us to why we created them. (Answer 4) As we make decisions about the life of the congregation, where we are headed, what needs to be done, how we do things, we keep the guiding principles in front of us sort of like a roadmap that helps us determine which route to take. We ask questions to make sure whatever we are doing is reflecting where we believe we are being called to go.

Take the roof, for instance. What’s the roof got to do with Jesus is Lord, being welcoming, allowing everyone to make a difference, valuing God’s people in our ministries, living in a changing world?

Well ... everything we do, who we are, who we are called to be is centered on our belief that Jesus is Lord and Savior – that’s just a given!

We are called to care for all that God has entrusted to us – that’s called stewardship. One of the things we have been entrusted to care for is our physical building.



In order to be a welcoming place, our building needs to not only look nice, but more importantly, it needs to be a safe place to welcome all, so all may know God’s love. Dodging buckets of water when the roof leaks or wondering if a ceiling tile will fall down on your head along with a stream of water, is not exactly welcoming.

As a community, we walk together, all of us – all ages, all abilities – using the gifts we have been given to make a difference. We use our intellect to create a plan. We use our hands to do certain tasks. We use our creativity and resources to find ways to help raise funds.

The time has come for us to invest our time, talents, and treasures into our building. We need to have a safe place to be able to carry out the worship and ministries we have been called to do ... baptizing, marrying, burying, sharing God's love in Word and Sacrament, singing God's praises, educating children and adults, feeding children lunches, providing groceries to feed those who are hungry, feeding our neighbors, making quilts to keep people warm and give them a sense of security, knitting prayer shawls to wrap folks in prayer and love, gathering together to share each other's joys & celebrations, pains & sorrows.

Those who care for our building have been looking around, making a list and checking it twice, to figure out what our priorities might be for the next few years



... replacing the flat roof to keep us dry, replacing the ceiling tiles, replacing the lights to illumine the path to the front door, tuckpointing the building to keep the bricks from crumbling and to keep the cold and critters out, paving the parking lot to provide a smooth surface to park our cars, walk, and maybe even play some basketball! Nothing glamorous, nothing flashy, but necessary to continue to be welcoming, faithful, and good stewards of all God has entrusted to us.

The work we do here in this place does not stop here, our work reaches beyond our walls, out into the neighborhood, the community, and the world.

That's what a roof has to do with it!

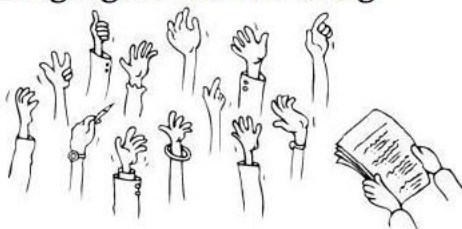


We **Zoom 10 AM Sunday worship** (check out our home page for the link and have your Communion elements handy!)

Special Congregational Meeting



Special Congregational Meeting

June 4, 2023

After 10 AM worship – approximately 11 AM

The Congregation Council has called a special congregational meeting to consider several proposals to address building needs. The meeting will consider:

- Replacement of the flat roof.
- Replacement of the lights leading to the Leonard Street entrance.
- Tuckpointing of the brick and caulking of windows.
- Authorization to use the Parsonage Fund as needed to complete the repairs approved.

The Council will also share a tentative 3-5-year plan to address other building needs including the parking lot and the pitched roof of the sanctuary.

These are the only items on the agenda; no other business will be in order at this meeting.

Your presence is important as we consider how best to care for the gift and resource of our building. Thank you for your partnership in our work together on behalf of the gospel of Jesus Christ!

Planning ahead ...

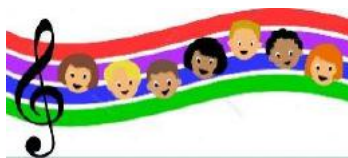
It may only be June, but it's never too early to start thinking about the fall ... *really, it's not!*

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, May 8, with President Jeff Haldeman presiding. Also present were 21 additional congregation leaders. At this meeting the council:

- Shared in conversation about church buildings and the ministries they support, and devotions based on Ephesians 4:7, 12-13.
- Engaged in a discussion with congregation leaders over proposals from the Property Community and DBS Group for needed maintenance and repairs on the building over the next few years.
- Received significant advice and counsel from the leaders present, with a consensus to act on the roof and the outside lighting immediately, and to develop a 3-5-year plan to address additional needs.
- Thanked the leaders who joined the meeting for their insights and guidance.
- Deferred action on a number of agenda items to the June meeting.
- Decided to hold a special congregational meeting on Sunday, June 18, following the 10 AM worship service. *(Note: This meeting has since been rescheduled for June 4.)*
- Decided to move the June meeting to June 19, and to keep the July meeting on the schedule pending the outcome of the special congregational meeting.

The next meeting of the council will be held Monday, June 19 at 7 PM. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Jeff Haldeman or one of the pastors.

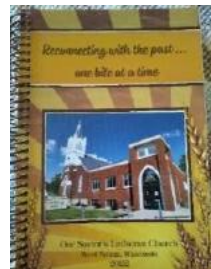
