Pastor's Reflections ...

Picture this ...

It's beckoning. Sabbatical is calling me. Just a few more weeks, and then ... then what?

Plans are in place – I'm working with a crew to prepare them to be preachers this summer, giving Pastor Jean a bit of a respite. And I'm hoping to have some social media stuff in place (more on that in a moment). And of course, there's the general administrative concerns ... like who will approve bills for payment, getting confirmation materials and schedules ready so I don't have to rush through that in late August when I return, and making sure we have the cashflow in place for the building projects. Lots to do – and I'll get there – I have to!



But I'm also thinking of what the Sabbatical itself will look like. I've got some small projects to tackle, and a few goals to achieve (like a bit more bike riding with Rebecca), but the biggie is really not about "big." It's about "small."

Let me explain.

In late July Pastor Jean, Rebecca, and I will embark on a trip out west. Our intent had been to visit two of Pastor Jean's aunts. After Margie's death in April, we have one to visit – Glenndia in Washington. On the way we will be consumed with a lot of "bigness":

- Big, open spaces to cross in Montana, Wyoming, and the Dakotas ...
- The big Teton range, towering over Jackson Hole as we approach from the East ...
- Mount Rainier, one of the biggest stratovolcanoes in North America ...

- Dipping our toes in the Pacific, the biggest ocean around ...
- Walking the Hoh Rainforest, and gazing at big trees that reach almost up to the sky ...

Lots of “bigness!” Lots of “what an awesome world God has created!” And ... lots of camera angles!



Which brings me to another part of my sabbatical. I want to work on some photography. Pictures of the Tetons, Mount Rainier, the Pacific, the rainforest, along with waterfalls, rushing streams, and wildlife.

Pictures of God’s magnificent handiwork. I’m pumped!

But...I also want to try something new. I want to go “macro.” In photography, “macro” really means “micro.” Macro photography is taking pictures of small things – like insects, flowers, drops of water, and other small, easily overlooked treasures, and making them literally “larger than life.”



To do that I’ve bought a special lens, a macro lens, which will allow me to focus in on really small stuff. The lens also allows for what is called “bokeh,” or the blurring of the background so the subject stands out. I’m excited to play with my new toy!

The new toy, however, won’t be enough. I also need to work on seeing what would otherwise not be seen. And that will take insight and practice. I’m going to have to think differently, seeing what I haven’t seen before, expanding my horizons, and developing a creative eye.

And ... I just might need to rethink “bigness.” Yes, God’s magnificent handiwork in the big stuff, like mountains, waterfalls, oceans, towering trees, and mighty beasts of the field. But also, God’s magnificent handiwork in tiny insects,

small flowers, exquisite designs of nature, and even more that exists just under my nose, but never seen. All that “hard-to-see” stuff.

That might just be the “big” takeaway from this sabbatical. Yes, the incredible grandeur of mountains, waterfalls, and more. But also, the incredible grandeur of the intricacies of that which is small, even tiny. Incredible grandeur that has always been there, but rarely noticed. Rarely noticed by me, at least.



So, my plan is to use my new lens, and my challenge will be to find one picture a day of God at work in our world. Sometimes I'll find something big, and sometimes it will be something otherwise mundane. And sometimes it will be something small, overlooked, unnoticed.

We are currently working to create some new social media outlets – Instagram and Facebook for starters. I'm hoping we have that in place by the end of May, and I'll work to post a “pic-a-day.” And if that eludes my creativity, then I'll go to plan B – 90 pics in 90 days. But one way or another, I'll share what I find.

We'll share the details in the June newsletter, but for now, join me in keeping an eye out for God's work that is otherwise unnoticed – either because of its size, or just what we would otherwise miss – you now, the mundane stuff.

Oh, and pray too. Pray that I begin to get that “creative eye,” an eye to seeing deeper or more profoundly where God is at work, right in front of me!

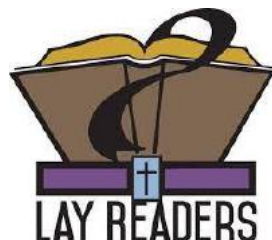

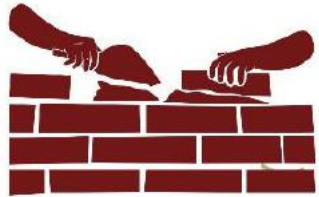

completed last month!

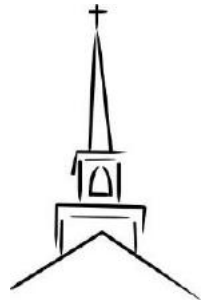
Flat roof ... scheduled to begin the week of May 13

The repair of the flat roof was authorized in June of 2023, and was delayed by the “busy-ness” following the storm last July. The project is long overdue as the flat roof, with a 20-year life expectancy, is around 25 years old!

Pitched roof and siding storm damage ... soon

The pitched roof, siding, and skylights, which were damaged in the storm last July, will be replaced following the completion of the flat roof. The roof was part of our long-term

plan, and while insurance will not cover the full cost, it will significantly reduce our future outlays. We expect this to be completed by early June.

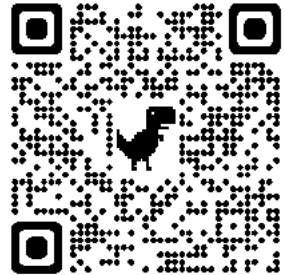

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, April 8, with President Jeff Haldeman presiding.

At this meeting the council:

- Shared favorite Bible stories as part of devotions.
- Approved minutes from the March meeting, and received financial reports and pastor's reports.
- Heard that new signage is close to being installed.
- Heard an update on youth ministry conversations, including mission trip possibilities. Also heard that there may be some interest in the youth ministry position.
- Heard that the old organ will be removed and the new organ installed on May 5. Dedication is planned for Memorial Day weekend.
- Heard that the work on the building (starting with tuckpointing) should begin April 9, concluding close to the end of May.
- Discussed strengthening the counting process. Decided that counting should not begin until the end of the second service on Sundays and that there is a need to recruit and train additional counters to assist the current crew.
- Discussed the rental home and decided to increase the base rent to \$900/month when the new lease begins.
- Heard an update on Pastor Jon's sabbatical plan, including the preaching schedule.
- Received as voting members the 40 individuals who will be affirming their baptisms on April 14 and April 28.
- Decided to act on the membership review at the May meeting.

Mission Endowment Fund

We continue our series of articles on Endowments, what they are, what they do, and how they can support the ministry of Our Savior's Mission Endowment Fund in ways that work for you.

Retirement Plans

Retirement Plans can lead to significant income taxes for heirs of a retiree. The fact is, often retirees do not draw installments from their IRAs or other retirement plans. This leads to substantial retirement plans passing at death to the named beneficiaries. These heirs will face ordinary income taxes at their frequently high-income tax brackets. Changing the retirement plan beneficiary designation to make Our Savior's or some other ministry the beneficiary of a portion of the retirement plan provides the dual benefit of being a gift to ministry that also avoids income taxation on the portion of the retirement plan proceeds given to ministry. Utilization of a remainder trust may provide income to heirs, spread out the taxable income, and ultimately provide a gift to ministry. Think about the needs of your heirs and talk to a gift planner about whether a portion of your qualified retirement plan or IRA should be given to a ministry at your death.

Gifts to Our Savior's can be directed toward the ongoing ministry of the congregation, or to the Mission Endowment Fund, ensuring that those gifts will continue to make a difference for years to come.

As always, it is important to consult a financial professional to see how this might work for you
