Pastor's Reflections ...

God was there ... we are blessed ...

Don't blink ... the old year has passed right before our eyes and we are staring 2025 in the face! Are you ready? Didn't 2024 just start? Where did it go? All the planning and anticipating ... and it's gone!



I'm guessing there were also times that it seemed like it would never end ... there were challenges we had to face, struggles to overcome, roadblocks and hurdles we hadn't anticipated, surprises that we had to deal with.



No matter what was placed before us, we did not have to face it alone. God was always there with us ... According to a wise theologian at our wedding, God was actually already there, waiting for us.

Cleaning up after the storm of 2023 seemed like it would never end. But we finally have a new roof and siding. Once the roof was fixed, we had confidence in being able to replace the ceiling tiles in the gathering area, library, and sacristy/annex. The Property Committee has been working hard to get things spruced up and fixed up. God was there ... we are blessed ...

No project is without "glitches," but with the right people shepherding the projects, the glitches were resolved. God was there ... we are blessed ...

We continue living into our new tech system, being able to livestream worship, using the screen to share pictures and

Sunday School and confirmation are humming along with our “seasoned” teachers and several new young adults ... all are faithful. God was there ... we are blessed ...

Throughout the year we have had several new families, couples, and singles joining us in worship ... and they keep coming back! God was there ... we are blessed ...



The Capital Campaign is moving into the last year and we are getting close to achieving our goal. God was there ... we are blessed ...

Music ministry has welcomed new voices to join the “old” faithful, we have instruments accompanying the singing, and bells ringing. God was there ... we are blessed ...

Thanks to a generous gift, we were able to replace our “faithful for many years, but worn-out” old organ with a brand new one that sounds awesome and has fun features for the future. God was there ... we are blessed ...

Those who are homebound have been visited and fed from the table by a faithful group of lay folks. God was there ... we are blessed ...



Babies (and young adults) have been baptized, couples have been married, and folks have been buried ... God’s Word has been preached and we have been fed by the sacraments ... God was there ... we are blessed ...

The food pantry has serviced record breaking numbers of clients, and summer lunch served over 200 (?) children twice a week. The Norwegian Dinner profits, Mission Endowment Fund disbursements, and WELCA Ruth Circle offerings have been shared with numerous ministries locally, nationally, and globally who care for those who are marginalized, vulnerable, struggling. God was there ... we are blessed ...

Whatever was placed before us, we were confident that God was already there waiting for us ... to walk with us along the path, sometimes guiding our steps, and other times carrying us when we couldn't do it alone ... God was there to share in our joys, celebrating with us ... God was there in the hurt and sorrow, wiping away our tears, giving us strength to carry on. 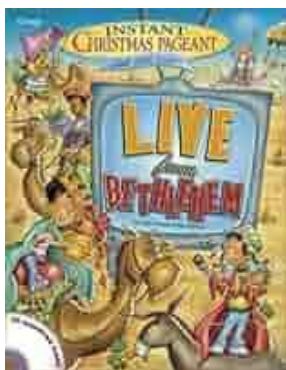
Sunday School

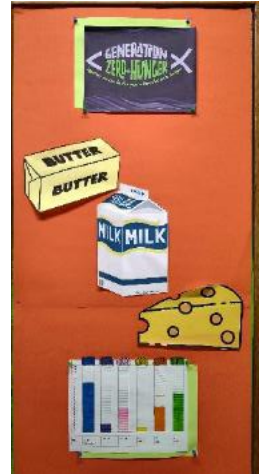

Recently, the Mission Endowment Fund committee prepared the 2024 disbursement proposal, which will be acted upon at the 2025 annual meeting. Over \$19,000 shared with a variety of ministries and programs that in a variety of ways meet human needs.

Since its inception in 2003 the Mission Endowment Fund has distributed over \$279,000. Adjusted for inflation that is over \$370,000 in today's dollars. That's a lot of ministry! We are grateful for all who have included this ministry and Our Savior's in their estate planning.

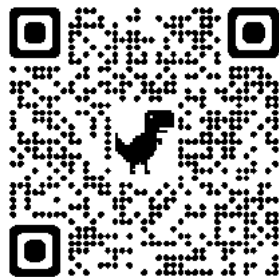

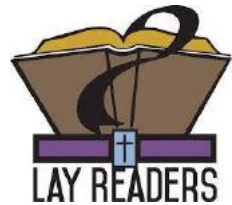
