Pastor's Reflections ...

In case you hadn't noticed, Easter is late this year. Really late. Easter can range from March 22 to April 25. Why? Because Easter falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon on or after the equinox, and all those moving parts make the date a matter of astronomical calculation, in more ways than one. Best to just Google it and let someone else figure it out!

By the way, the rarest Easter is March 22, and we are currently in the midst of the biggest dry spell for that date. 1818 was the last "March 22 Easter" – and the next one won't be until 2285. Don't wait up for that!

But back to the "late Easter." This year Easter falls on April 20, really pushing that last possible date thing. It's almost as if Jesus just isn't quite ready to pop out of the tomb. And to be honest, I'm not sure I blame him. Would you be eager to show your face in the world we are in right now?

Of course, the world is pretty messed up these days. Now, truth be told, the world has always been pretty messed up – sin does that to us. But this year seems more than most. And in a messed up world, what's in it for Jesus? With all the strife, conflict, challenges, and denial (of Jesus) going on, why bother? Better perhaps to sleep it off a bit. Maybe next year will be better?

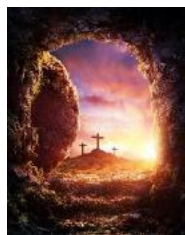
And then ... if Jesus does show his face, in this crazy, upside down world, how much of the blame will he get? How many folk, church folk and non-church folk alike, will turn to Jesus and say, "How come," and "So, what are you going to do about it all?"

The smart play, the strategic play, is to just lay low for a while. Wait a bit until the heat is off.

Like I said, maybe next year will be better!

Makes sense to me. But Jesus has never done the sensible thing. From the first days of ministry in Galilee to his journey to Jerusalem. From his entry on a donkey to his dinner with his rather feckless group of disciples. From his chewing out of those who draw the sword to defend him to his silence before Pontius Pilate as he is sentenced to death. From his willingness to forgive those who crucified him to his embrace of all humanity as he dies on the cross. Again and again, not sensible things to do!

Even the Apostle Paul figured out this was pretty un-sensible. He proclaims that “we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to some, and foolishness to others” (1 Corinthians 1:23).



So, with all that un-sensible behavior, what's Jesus going to do? He's coming out, that's what he's going to do. For better or worse, Jesus is both literally and figuratively (if you will forgive the language) hell-bent on emerging from the tomb and re-engaging a really broken and messed up world.

And in the end, that shouldn't really be much of a surprise. Non-sensible, to be sure. But this isn't really about “crazy Jesus” doing that “crazy Jesus thing.” In the end, it's really about Jesus simply being Jesus.

Long before all this, Jesus was labeled. In Matthew even before Jesus was born, an angel spilled the beans to Joseph. “You will call him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins” (1:21). And then in Luke, an angel (maybe the same one), backed up by a whole chorus of angels, tipped off the shepherds about the baby in a manger who just, by the way, happens to be the savior.

So it is that this “crazy Jesus thing” is what Jesus is about, all the way back to the very beginning. It wasn’t merely his destiny. It is what he is!

And what he is, is all about renewing and restoring life. And you can’t do that hiding in a tomb!

So out he comes, out into our cold, broken, hurting world. Out to be in our midst, to walk our paths, and to share in our brokenness. That’s what it means to be “incarnate” (remember from Christmas, “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us” John 1:14?).

And that’s the really crazy part about Jesus – and the God who sends Jesus to us. The crazy desire to actually share with us in the world that we have so royally messed up. What a gift of grace to be willing to walk the walk we have to walk. And to do so, not with some sense of righteous anger, but instead with care, love, nurture, and forgiveness. The care, love, nurture and forgiveness born of the cross.

And to do so actively. Jesus doesn’t just emerge from the tomb to stretch his legs a bit and take a stroll. He comes out, the risen one, ready to engage, embrace, and renew a world that’s really short on hope and life.



Jesus comes forth as the savior, but doesn’t look about for a cheering crowd. He comes forth seeking out the hurting, the broken, the vulnerable, the sinful, in order to restore life. Life in you ... and in me.

So yes, we have to wait a bit longer. Last year Easter was so early it was in March (March 31). This year, weeks later.



But hey, it’s worth the wait!

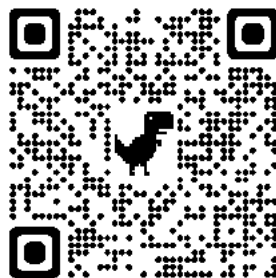

Congregation Council

The Congregation Council met on Monday, March 10, President Brenda Skittone called the meeting to order.

At this meeting the council:

- Welcomed Eric Ender to share the first of a series of reflections on generosity and faithful living.
- Approved the minutes from the February meeting, and received financials for February and the pastors' reports.
- Heard a report from Jeff Haldeman and Brenda Skittone on the 2025 Sugar Creek Annual Meeting.
- Acted to consolidate funds available for Sugar Creek Camperships so they can be tracked and disbursed more efficiently.
- Heard reports on a number of congregational ministries including worship and the pictorial directory.
- Received a report from the Audit Committee, noting no issues with the congregation's financial reports.
- Received membership lists for the congregation and asked to review the lists for consideration at the April meeting.
- Decided to create a scholarship for Sugar Creek Camp staff from Our Savior's in the amount of \$1,500.
- Heard that there are computer issues both with our units and with backup programs, and that the office is seeking assistance to resolve the issues.
- Appointed Karly Baganz to serve Scott Thompson's term on the Mission Endowment Fund Committee until the 2026 annual meeting.
- Heard information about a council workshop sponsored by the synod later in March.
