Pastor's Reflections ...

What is Christmas Spirit?

It's over. Another Christmas done, decorations packed away, the music fading, the tree losing needles, the cookies part of my waistline, and I'm moving on, moving on to...

A new year, annual meeting, the cold and snow, and yes, Lent already on the horizon! So, it's time to get going, get over it, and get past the past and head to the future.

But wait? Did we get everything? Did we forget anything? Well, there is that "Christmas spirit" thing, whatever that is. Every year it seems we relish the atmosphere of the season and then wonder how we can hang on to it into a new year. Or does it just end up packed away in one of the boxes?

But just what is "Christmas spirit" anyway? Warm fuzzies? Happy thoughts? Got to be more than that!

OK, maybe it's a sense of generosity and appreciation. Or maybe it's, in the words of Sheryl Crowe years ago, *"Not getting what you want, but wanting what you've got"* ... being satisfied and not always looking for more. Or maybe it's a love and care for people, a genuine "I'm going to look out for others" attitude, and not just in December, but year-round.

Good ideas, but I also wonder if the "Christmas spirit" also depends on the world around us. That is to say, perhaps the "Christmas spirit" is a response to the needs of the world. In that case, let me toss another idea at you.



Recently, Bishop Malpica noted that the ELCA is one of the few places left where people across the broad political spectrum gather and engage in community. We have folks from the left and right. We have Democrats and Republicans. We have Donald Trump fans and Kamala Harris fans. Some recent surveys put it at a 50/50 mix.



That makes us unique. Where else do you have that kind of gathering of people from across what has become “the great divide?” And ... where else is there the opportunity for people on different sides to come together, to be community together, and to actually care for one another?

The Bishop suggested that may be our role (or one role at least) for us as a church in a very conflicted and fractured society. To listen and care for each other. And perhaps most importantly, to respect each other as precious and cherished children of God. And then ... to model that respect for each other out in society, in a world that is desperately needing to find ways to bridge the gaps between people.

Maybe, just maybe, that is the “Christmas spirit” that the world is yearning for these days. A “Christmas spirit” of respect for others, and especially for the “others” with whom I disagree and sometimes don’t like at all.

That kind of “Christmas spirit” is not about politics, it’s about humanity. But it is grounded in God’s work in the world. In the child of Bethlehem, God joins our very human and troubled journey, getting cold and dirty in the process. God is here, in our midst, in the center of the storm.

But God's care is not about winning the race, making sure it all goes "my way." God's care is about people. All people. God cares about the rich and poor, the citizen and the immigrant, the white and people of color. Even politicians!



God cares about people because that's what God does! And that's why there was a Christmas long ago, and a "re-celebration" of Christmas again only days ago. Because God insists on joining our journey, walking with humanity, in order to renew and restore ALL of humanity.

And now in a new year, we move on (remember) all the way to Lent ... and then beyond Lent to the cross and the empty tomb. God at work in a child, who is the Christ, who becomes the Christ on the cross, and then becomes the Christ risen. Risen to bring life and hope to ALL humanity.

That's the care God has for people. ALL people. And that is the core of our respect for the others, even and especially for those whom I would quite frankly prefer not to care for or to respect. And maybe that is our "Christmas spirit" for 2026!

We should try to hold on to the Christmas spirit, not just one day a year, but all 365.

To hang on to the "Christmas spirit" is to take one last glimpse at the baby in the manger, basking for a moment in

the awe and wonder of God coming into our world, in a child, to walk the cold and painful journey with us.

But then also to glance ahead and see that child on the cross, giving up life for me. And for you. And for those folk on the other side.

And then, in the power of the Holy Spirit, taking the time to listen, making the effort to care, and working hard (yes, it's hard work) to respect them as people dearly loved by a gracious God. Loved, just as God loves me.

Let The Spirit Of Christmas Live

And finally, living that out long after the boxes are packed away, the gifts forgotten, and even long after the snow is gone. Living out the "Christmas spirit" year-round.

Grounded in the Christ of manger, cross and tomb, maybe this "Christmas spirit" can really last, and can really change the world. Or at least my corner of it!

Join us as we hear the story of the ages...in the stories that have aged so well!

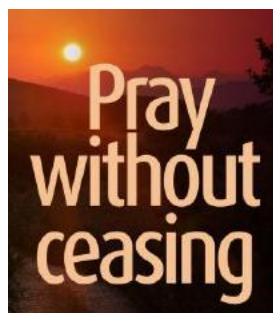

in the Koinonia...we gather and...we pray!

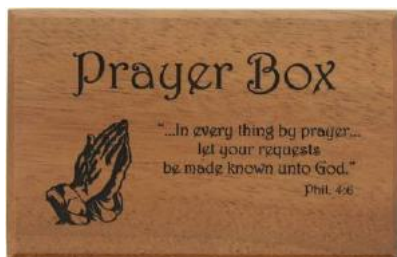
Join us for some quiet time of sharing and

include those concerns in our prayers. Because...

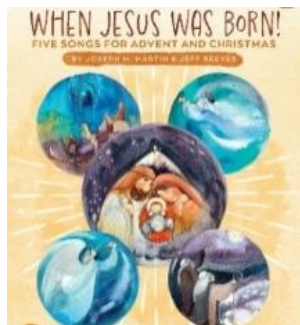

Congregation Council Review

The Congregation Council met on Monday, December 8, at Pastor Jon and Pastor Jean's home, with President Brenda Skittone presiding.

At this meeting the council:

- Approved the minutes from the November meeting and received financials for November and the pastors' reports.
- Took action to set the pastor's housing allowance for 2026 for tax purposes.
- Discussed nominations for leadership positions including those already secured and those needing to be filled. Determined a process to move forward to secure the remaining nominations.
- Heard an update on several building issues including windows, elevator, and the Leonard Street door.
- Heard that Kris Seeger will retire in early June. Directed the Administration Committee to proceed with a hiring process later in 2026.

After closing with prayer, the council gathered with families to celebrate Christmas. The council next meets on Monday, January 12 at 7 PM. If you have questions, or if you have ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Brenda Skittone or one of the pastors.



Annual Meeting – 2026

The 2026 Annual Meeting for Our Savior's will be held Sunday, January 25, following the 10:30 worship service. Among the business items

will be the consideration of several constitutional amendments and bylaws. Per the constitution these proposals must be shared with the congregation at least 30 days prior to the meeting. As several of the proposals are lengthy, full copies are available from the office.

Proposal Number 1 – adoption of numerous amendments to the constitution as adopted by the 2025 Churchwide Assembly.

These amendments consist of a number of small editorial changes and clarifications in the language of the constitution. As this was adopted by the Churchwide Assembly, a majority vote at one congregational meeting is required.

Proposal Number 2 – amendment to bylaw C8.05.01 – defining discontinuance of membership.

The amendment clarifies that persons who neither commune nor contribute over the course of one year may be removed from membership, but that they remain persons for whom the congregation has continuing pastoral care. A two-thirds majority vote is required at one congregational meeting.

Proposal Number 3 – amendment to C12.05 – setting limits on what the Council can spend without congregational approval.

The amendment removes the limits from C12.05, and places them in a bylaw (C12.05.01). The new bylaw replaces the current limit of \$5,000 for items not in the

budget, or \$10,000 in extraordinary circumstances with a unanimous council vote, with 4% and 6% respectively, of the most recently adopted budget amount. As this proposal includes both constitution and bylaw changes, it requires a two-thirds majority vote at one congregational meeting, and ratification by a two-thirds majority vote at the next annual meeting. The changes will not be in effect until both votes have been taken and passed.

Proposal Number 4 – changes to nomination process through adoption of C13.02.05.

This bylaw allows the annual meeting to delegate the nomination process to the Congregation Council rather than elect a Nominating Committee. This proposal affirms the process we have followed for the past several years. Approval requires a two-thirds majority vote at one congregational meeting.

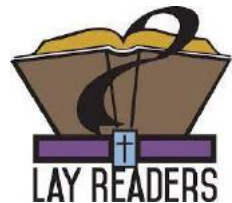
