Pastor's Reflections ...

What do you see?

Have you ever thought about what your life would be like if you had no eyesight?



Our sight is a gift from God. But for those who have never experienced those sights, they are given even more precious gifts from God. Their appreciation of God's beauty can be



found in the scents that surround us, in the sounds that stir them, and in the textures that are sensitive to touch. Sometimes I wonder if our sight is all that it's cracked up to be.

Of course, without sight, there are a lot of things that are missed ...

... a sunset with the colors glistening on the water, dark storm clouds, rolling hills of cornfields, rolling waves crashing against the rocks, the vibrant colors of a rainbow against a dark sky, a dark sanctuary bathed in candlelight, deep oranges, reds and yellow leaves in the fall.

We are surrounded by beauty and colors, all soaked in with the gift of sight. Without sight, we miss it all.

Or maybe not. Maybe there is more to sight than what we can see. The power of imagination, of seeing that which is not seen with the eyes, but seen even more deeply with the mind. The gift of being freed from the "eyesight" and instead being gifted with the "mind sight."

Or even with the "eyesight," the wonder of the memories. Closing your eyes, shutting out the distractions, and recalling the scenes, the beauty, the colors.

And then there is the baggage of eyesight. The ways in which what we see skews our vision of the world around us. The ways in which we make judgements and decisions based on sight, instead of substance. Like the person of



another color, or with a disability, or someone who looks too old or too young. Our eyes are open, but we don't really see.

Now imagine, for a moment, not having the gift of eyesight. Of being “eye blind.” That would be terrible, wouldn't it? Or would it? No “colors” as we know them, but also no color of the skin to judge. And no beauty to “over-honor” or lack of beauty to avoid. No fancy clothes to wow us, and no physical imperfections to convince us the other isn't quite as whole.

Instead, maybe going beyond “eyesight” we could love each other for who they are, unconditionally, as a whole person, as a whole gift of God. We could treat each other as individuals worthy of respect and care, not discriminating because of what they look like, what sports team they cheer for, what language they speak, who they identify as, who they love.



Maybe we could love them as God loves them. (Hmm ... is God a “blind” God seeing more than we could ever imagine?)



We live in a broken world, a world where colors stir our emotions. We don't always see the beauty in the colors; sometimes we react negatively because of a color, because of a previous

experience with a color, because we are told a color represents something bad, something we need to fear.

In an episode of M.A.S.H., Hawkeye temporarily loses his sight, and instead of saying how horrible it was, he marvels at what he learns from his other senses ... what he hears, what he smells, what he feels ... things that most people take for granted or don't pay attention to ...



- ... the scent of a loved one's perfume, fresh bread baking, a campfire, laundry right out of the dryer, a newly mopped floor, flowers in the garden...
- ... rain gently falling on the ground, a bird singing in the tree, a crackling fire, a car driving by, the wind blowing through the trees, the whisper of a child, a bee buzzing...
- ... snuggling a new baby, the soft fur of a kitten, damp grass, a cold ice cube, wet clay between your fingers, the scruffy stubble of an unshaven face, the hardness of a rock, the tickle of a feather, the breeze from a fan...

What if we were like Hawkeye, losing our sight temporarily, losing our prejudices, losing what we thought we knew, losing the feelings and emotions that are triggered by colors. What if instead we started over with a blank slate and "saw" things through new eyes, and new senses. Maybe then we could "see" people for *who* they are, not *what* they are. We could listen and understand their hurts, pains, and fears. We could celebrate their joys and accomplishments. We could share a hug, a gentle touch. Maybe we could see people through the eyes of Jesus.



Lent is upon us ... a time for reflection, introspection, and repentance. It is a time to walk with Jesus, ponder his words, model his ways, feel his forgiveness.

What if we go through our Lenten journey seeing each other through the eyes of Jesus – eyes that see love and not color; eyes that don't prejudge but instead see things as if for the first time; eyes that care not with the head but with the heart.



Maybe being "blind" might not be so bad after all ... and maybe God is a bit blind too. But back to your eyes, and the eyesight you really have ... how will you use your gift of sight as we head to the cross with Jesus?

Each week will be a different “unit,” so you won’t be “out of sync” if you happen to be absent, but remember that there is always livestream or the YouTube video to “catch up.”

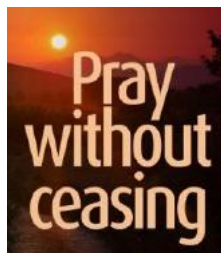

Congregation Council Review

The Congregation Council met on Monday, January 12, with President Brenda Skittone presiding.

At this meeting the council:

- Approved the minutes from the December meeting and received financials for December and the pastors' reports.
- Heard updates on several ministries including worship, grief ministry, and visitors/new members.
- Received Tadd and Kaytie Duescher into membership.
- Heard an update on several projects at Johnson South rental property.
- Heard an update on several building projects including windows throughout the building.
- Received a quote from TDS to provide internet and phone service. Authorized switching our service to TDS.
- Discussed nominations for the annual meeting; noted that nominees are still needed for voting member at the La Crosse Area Synod Assembly.
- Received the budget proposal from the Administration Committee and after some discussion, voted to recommend the budget to the annual meeting.

Chaired by President Brenda Skittone, the congregation:

- Began the meeting with devotions, asking God's presence and the power of the Spirit in our work.
- Received reports from the pastors, the president, committees and ministries, and financial reports reflecting the work of Our Savior's in 2025.
- Elected Mya Koudelka, Kyle Hehl, Dan Steele, and Mike Larson to three-year terms on the Congregation Council.
- Thanked the outgoing council members (Bonnie Gensch, Carolyn Karl, Jaime Fortier, and Chad Vick), all four of whom served six years!
- Re-elected Karly Baganz and Katie Drury to the Mission Endowment Fund Committee.
- Elected as voting members Jeff Haldeman and Brenda Skittone to Sugar Creek, and Carolyn Karl and Eric Ender to Eagle Crest Communities.
- Elected Bonnie Gensch as synod assembly voting member, with the council to appoint two other members.
- Adopted the proposed budget for 2026.

- Approved the disbursements for the Mission Endowment Fund.
- Approved four resolutions containing amendments to the constitution and bylaws.
- Closed the meeting with prayer led by Pastor Jon.

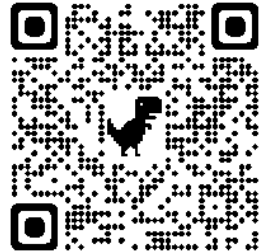

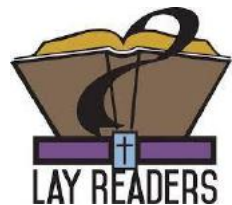
