Pastor's Reflections ...

Lent and Prayer

As you read this, you are well into Lent. But as I write this the season is only hours old. 40 days to go! Well, actually 46 days to Easter – 40 days of Lent because Sundays don't count - every Sunday is a mini-Easter.

But I digress. Back to Lent. Lent is more than the “let's remember what Jesus did” season. That is part of Lent. Remembering the journey that Jesus makes, ending in Jerusalem where he will suffer and die. The passion of Jesus is a powerful story, and a poignant reminder of the grace of God through Jesus. This is what God is all about. Not just a sideline, or sidebar story. This is it – God at work, no more messing around, just doing what needs to be done for the sake of God's people – for your sake and for mine.



So, listen to the story (Wednesday Lenten worship dramas are good for that), ponder what God is doing, relish that it is being done *for you*, and then ... then what?

That too is part of what Lent is about.



I've worked on my sermon for Sunday, February 22, and I'm going to reference the very end of the Gospel of Matthew. In Matthew 28:19 Jesus sends his disciples out into the world to make disciples. Like us. Like our children and young people. Like the visitors who join us in worship. Like all of God's people everywhere. Disciples.

But disciples don't just pop up. Disciples and discipleship need nurture. They need molding and shaping, witnesses and role models (check out page 21 for more on that in the family).



And they need “exercise.” Discipleship, in both those who are and those who will be disciples, needs to be worked at and developed. And that is both the opportunity and the gift of Lent. A time to grow and strengthen what God calls us to be – disciples!

A seminary classmate of mine was a big baseball fan. She always thought of Lent like “spring training” in baseball. A time to renew and restore, and time to do a bit of experimenting and discovery, a time to grow in discipleship.

Of course, this opportunity for growing in discipleship is not just limited to the 40/46 days of Lent. It's really a 365 (or in a leap year, 366) day thing. More properly it's “24/7.” It's the very life we are created for and called to engage in.

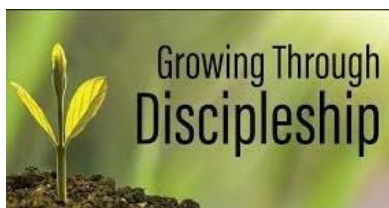


But how to do that? Wear ashes until Easter morning, or even year round? Maybe soup suppers are the answer ... or, as we enjoy singing “Holden Evening Prayer” during Lent, we should scrap the liturgy and just do Holden? Or give something up ... forever? No using the “A” word, and skipping anything really upbeat because, well, it's Lent?

Yeah, I suppose, but do you really think any of that really creates disciples and nurtures discipleship? Now, don't get me wrong – really, all of those are good things. I wore ashes on Ash Wednesday, I love Holden, I give up a few things,

and I'm not using the "A" word. But none of that really, down deep, changes anything.

So maybe I should just try harder to be a good Christian. With a little more effort, maybe I'll get a better return?



Or maybe Lent ... discipleship ... and me as a disciple ... all need something else. Maybe it ... and I ... need relationship. Relationship with the one who is on center stage,

the one of the cross and the tomb that will lie empty.

Relationship with the God of life. A relationship nurtured and molded through the gift of prayer.

Someone recently asked me about a prayer style I had once shared. I reminded her of the particular style, and then she suggested that maybe prayer would be a good theme for a series of newsletter articles. So, it is – and so I'm starting right here. A brief (to follow) reflection on prayer, and then in the coming months, each month, another thought on differing ways to pray, all valid and effective, just different, and maybe appropriate at different moments.

So let's start with this. Long ago, when my daughter was about five years old, I reflected on my relationship with her. I noted that she would occasionally climb up on my lap, give me a hug, and make her request. Sometimes it was a "yes," and sometimes ... not! But then I asked, would she have a better chance for a "yes" if she first consulted an attorney in order to articulate her request better?



Of course, not! It was not a well-structured or properly ordered request that secured a "yes." It was my love – her love – our relationship that made her request something powerful – even if the answer was "no!"

Before we worry about prayer styles and how to articulate or structure a prayer, we need to get the fundamentals out of the way – prayer is not about the right words, flattery, sweet sounding phrases, or sweet talk. It's not even about asking for the right things. It's about relationship. My relationship with a God who cares so much that Jesus Christ endures the passion, suffers the death, and rises victoriously. A God who simply loves me dearly!



That's what prayer is about – the relationship. And that's what Lent is about – the relationship. A relationship that grounds my faith and nurtures my discipleship.

So do all the things of Lent – soup suppers, give something up, and don't say the "A" word. Listen and reflect on the story and ponder how "God at work" works in you. But don't forget the prayer(s), and in prayer, engaging with God in a relationship.

In the next few months, I'll share some different prayer styles and techniques, but let's just be straight about one thing. There is NO right or wrong way to pray. Just as there is no right or wrong way to share your love and engage in a relationship. With a child, a spouse, or even a loving God.



Get that down first, and we'll go from there. But in the meantime, just have a chat with the one who has gifted you with life, called you to be a disciple, and then gifted you with ... even more life!

Even if you have to – or better yet, *get to* -- crawl up onto God's lap!

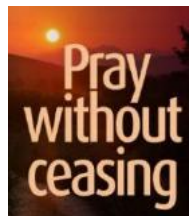

- Heard an update on a number of ministries.
