Pastor's Reflections ...

Lent and The Lord's Prayer

As I write this, we are winding down Lent ... as you read it we should be heading into Holy Week, hearing the reading of the passion story, Jesus washing the feet of the disciples, sharing in the Last Supper, and making his way to the cross, carrying the weight of all of our sins on his shoulders. The week climaxes on Easter morning when the stone is rolled away from the tomb, and it is empty. Jesus has risen! Alleluia!



Are we ready for Holy Week? Did we learn anything on our journey these last six weeks? Did we take time for reflection and contemplation? Did we think about repentance and how we are going to change our thoughts and ways? How we are going to embrace the new life we will be given at Easter?

It's not too late ...

During this coming year we will be focusing on prayer ... ways to pray, dwelling in the word, creating visual images.

As I think about the Lord's Prayer in the context of Lent, I am drawn to the words ... "Lead us not into temptation" ... and ... "Forgive us our trespasses".

Temptation is all around us, we face it every day, sometimes the temptation is subtle, and other times it's everywhere, too much to ignore, too much to push aside.

We were watching a M.A.S.H. rerun the other night and temptation was front and center. Dr. B.J. Hunnicutt, rule follower, devoted husband and father, not one to stray ... until Ms. Aggie O'Shea appears on the scene - journalist and

artist, attractive, engaging, compassionate, and smitten with B.J. Sparks flew; temptation was unmistakable. But, in the end, no commandments were broken.



Temptation isn't only found in T.V. programs. We are tempted to believe we have all of the answers, that our

way is always right, that we are better than others. We are tempted to ignore those who are on the margins or vulnerable, failing to see each other as precious children created by God. We are tempted to impose our beliefs on others and judge them according to our standards. We are tempted to not get involved when we see someone hurting or in need. We are tempted to take things or information when we are lacking what we need or want.

Temptation isn't anything new, and we aren't the only ones being tempted. The disciples were tempted and they failed ... It had been a long day and they fell asleep while Jesus went off to pray. Judas was enticed by silver and wealth, and betrayed Jesus placing him in the hands of the soldiers. The people were afraid to stand up for what they believed in, afraid of what life would be like if they didn't fit in, didn't follow the crowd, and they chose to honor Herod as their king. And, that's just during Holy Week.

The disciples prayed, "lead us not into temptation". We pray, "lead us not into temptation" ...

During this time of Lent we face our temptations and we reflect on what we have done, what we have left undone, and what we still can do. There is still time to place the temptations and our



actions upon the cross. There is time to pray "forgive us our trespasses". Remember, Holy Week!

We head to the foot of the cross on Good Friday, Jesus takes our temptations and sins upon his shoulders, and hears our prayer, “forgive us our trespasses.” And on Easter morning, the tomb is empty. Jesus has risen!

We unbury our Alleluias and freely shout them in celebration of Jesus rising from the dead. Not only do we celebrate Jesus’ resurrection and new life, we celebrate our new life in Christ, we celebrate the forgiveness of our sins, and we shout Alleluia!

Pastor Jon and I were gifted a beautiful cross recently, hand crafted from treasured family wood. The cross has multiple layers, and uses several kinds of wood of differing heights and widths. Each time you look at that cross you see something new – a new view, a new perspective – you see new life over and over again. Where sins were once placed, new life is found in the beauty of that cross. New life is found in the risen Jesus! Alleluia!

- We have met the enemy ... and he did what?

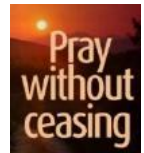
Join us as we hear the story of the ages ... in the stories that have aged so well!

All children deserve a safe, comfortable place to lay their heads. Across the US, too many boys and girls go without a bed—or even a pillow—to sleep on. These children end up sleeping on couches, blankets, and even floors. This can affect their happiness and health.

At SHP, they believe that a bed is a basic need for the proper physical, emotional, and mental support that a child needs. POSITION OPEN

It takes many hands to do the ministries of the church, some are obvious, while others are accomplished behind the scenes.

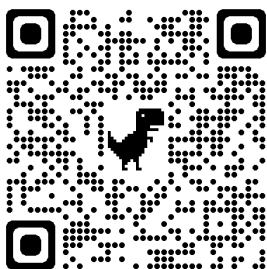
Food Ministries – Most churches are known for their good food, whether it's meals or simple coffee & treats ... and at the heart of it all is a time of fellowship and conversation. Our Savior's is no different. So many people volunteer their time and talents to provide meals and treats...

- ♥ **Coffee hour** - bakers and servers provide sweet treats and coffee between worship services on Sunday.
- ♥ **Funeral Lunch** - from preparation to clean up a meal at a time when people are hurting and seeking comfort. Others who can't be here provide salads and desserts.
- ♥ **Soup Suppers** - soup makers and bakers during Lent.
- ♥ **Easter Breakfast** - prepare and serve a simple breakfast.
- ♥ **Confirmation after school dinner** - (usually) parents prepare and serve a simple meal for the students to get them through the night of class.
- ♥ **Gospel on the Green Potluck** - lunch at the Lion's Shelter following worship.
- ♥ **Norwegian Dinner** - a multitude of volunteers come together to help prepare the meal, make desserts, serve, and clean up. An annual event with all proceeds going outside of the congregation for mission work.
- ♥ **Meals in time of need/crisis** - meals prepared and delivered to folks during a time of crisis or special need.

Congregation Council Review

The Congregation Council met on Monday, March 9, with President Brenda Skittone presiding.

At this meeting the council:

- Considered stewardship from several angles – money, trust, faithfulness, and people.
- Approved minutes from the February meeting; received financial reports, and the pastors' reports.
- Discussed summer worship time; decided to keep the summer Sunday worship at 8 and 10 AM, and retain worship on Saturday evening at 6.
- Received a request to consider a change in communion practice to be more environmentally sensitive. Directed the pastors to meet with persons who have this concern to more deeply explore options that might be available.
- Received a report from the Administration Committee. Reviewed and adopted a revised job description for the Administrative Assistant. Approved plans to acknowledge and thank Kris Seeger for her years of work upon her retirement in early June.
- Heard an update on several building issues in the church and the rental home.
- Approved a new cabinet for the Koinonia Room.
- Discussed the insurance quote received from Glatfelter through Crex Insurance. Tabled action on the quote to provide time for a more thorough review.
- Appointed Eric Iliff as a voting member at Synod Assembly. Noted that we are still seeking one more voting member.
- Heard a list of the needs for hosting the Synod pre-assembly caucus on April 19. Several members stepped forward to assist with the caucus.

The council next meets on Monday, April 13 at 7 PM. If you have questions or ideas for enhancing the ministry of Our Savior's, contact Brenda Skittone or one of the pastors.

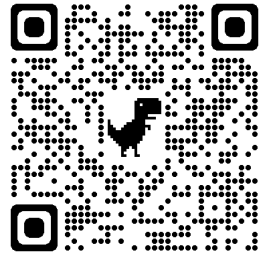

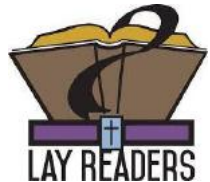
