

# **Our Savior's Lutheran Church – West Salem, WI College Freshman Scholarship Program 2022**

## **Purpose:**

The Our Savior's Lutheran Church College Freshman Scholarship Program has been established to recognize and support members of Our Savior's Lutheran Church who, as college freshman, have pursued their post-secondary education while remaining active in a faith community.

***For 2022 only this scholarship is also available to a current college sophomore.***

## **Criteria:**

Applicants must be:

- An active member of Our Savior's Lutheran Church, West Salem, WI.
- A college freshman, with plans to continue to pursue post-secondary education.
- Actively involved in a faith community (congregation or campus ministry), either at Our Savior's, or in their college location.

Applicants will also need to provide a letter from the ministry leader of the faith community, verifying their participation in that community.

Selection is based on the above criteria as well as the submitted application and essays.

## **Process:**

Applications due by May 2, 2022. Applications received after this date will not be considered. The Scholarship Committee will review applications, and then prayerfully select the recipient.

## **Notification:**

Applicants will be informed of the committee's decision prior to the High School Senior Graduate Recognition Sunday. Public acknowledgement will include:

- During worship on "backpack blessing" Sunday in September.
- Published in the September edition of Our Savior's Lutheran Church newsletter.
- Posted on the Our Savior's website after "back pack blessing Sunday."

## **Funding:**

Sources: The Meyer/Lewis Scholarship Fund  
The Adolph and Esther Marking Scholarship Fund

Amount: The amount will vary between \$250-\$750.

Recipients: The scholarship will be awarded to one freshman each year.

Payment: Scholarship money will be awarded early in the fall term of the sophomore year, after proof of continuing enrollment. Recipient must contact the church office by November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022.
