

***GOSPEL** Matthew 16:21-28


The Gospel according to Matthew. Glory to you, O Lord.



*LORD'S PRAYER




***POST COMMUNION PRAYER**

Hungry Jar Offering for September – Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR)

Multiple wildfires have broken out on the Hawaiian island of Maui. Exacerbated by strong winds, wildfires on Maui have claimed dozens of lives and have destroyed homes, businesses and lines of communication. Thousands of people are under evacuation orders, some moving to other Hawaiian Islands. Wildfires have also affected the Big Island of Hawaii, and the islands remain vulnerable to more fires this season. *As of this writing, hurricanes are pounding California, as well, and LDR will be there helping them too.*


LDR is coordinating with the Pacifica Synod and other partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires in Hawaii and hurricanes in California.
