
Let us confess our sin in the presence of God and of one another.







The Gospel according to Mark Glory to you, O Lord!



SERMON



*APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

We turn to you for healing. Send compassionate helpers to any who suffer because of war and violence. Shelter unhoused people, befriend those who are lonely, bring hope to any in despair, accompany those who are isolated, alone or homebound, especially Bobbie, and console the bereaved. Hear us, O God. **Your mercy is great.**

We turn to you for purpose. Remind us of your faithfulness to this congregation and to our living faith partners at Bethany Mauston. Increase our trust in your guidance and keep us near the cross. Grant that our acts of service will express Christ's sacrificial love. Hear us, O God.

Your mercy is great.

We turn to you for guidance. May your servants be faithful disciples of Jesus. Be with our confirmation students, especially Oliver, Candace, and Lily as they seek to grow in their discipleship, and guide their families that together they may reflect your love and grace. Hear us, O God, **Your mercy is great.**


*INVITATION TO COMMUNION

The weather outside is frigid ... this *is* Wisconsin! The La Crosse Warming Center's mission is to work with the greater La Crosse community to better serve those experiencing homelessness with dignity and respect by providing a safe and warm place for homeless adults 18 years and older to get in out of the cold during the winter months from November 1 until May 1. The Warming Center is located at 413 South Third Street in La Crosse. Guests are able to take a shower and wash their clothes. To keep the doors open, hundreds of volunteers from area churches and the community are needed to staff the center. Please be generous as we care for those who are hurting.
